
**January 27** Literacy Day

<b>Important weather reminders</b> Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school busses in the event of severe or inclement weather.
<ul> <li>It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:</li> <li>All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or</li> <li>All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or</li> <li>Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or</li> <li>All schools are closed for the day.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:</li> <li>Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and</li> <li>Non-bused students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.</li> </ul>
